Mary Elizabeth Sievert and John P. Whitaker Davenport Female Graduate Study Scholarship History:

The above scholarship was originally named the Davenport Female Graduate Study Scholarship. Upon the death of Mary Elizabeth Sievert on December 28, 2016, the branch voted to rename the scholarship to include the names of the founders of the original scholarship, which are two longstanding members of the Davenport-Bettendorf Branch of AAUW. It was their goal to reach out to all women seeking help for graduate study. They did stipulate that if you received the Glynn Fellowship, you were not qualified for this scholarship. Only the interest of the funds received will be used for the scholarship operations. Each applicant must have a legal permanent residence of Davenport or within 40 miles, and be able to show a college/university enrollment that indicates a continuing pursuit of education, and a good record-to-date. The scholarship funds are not retroactive. The award will be paid in January of the scholarship award year, once enrollment has been confirmed. Previous Davenport-Bettendorf scholarship recipients may re-apply.
