


# LEGISLATIVE FORUMS


# TRIAL ZOOM MEETING FOR CREATIVE WOMEN GROUP

#### A NEW TWIST TO THE GENDER GAP



The main goal of AAUW is to promote equity for women: in personal rights, the workplace, education, leadership. Have you ever wondered just how far we, as women, really have come?

According to Caroline Criado Perez, author of the book Invisible Women: Exposing Data Bias in a World Designed for Men, there are a myriad of places where we just don't know or realize that bias exists! Mrs. Perez espouses a gender data gap – places where research has not taken place, or if it has, the data has been ignored. "We are living in a world largely built for and by men," she explains. Men have become the model for humanity. Women's uniqueness is silent. From government policies, the buildings we enter, the

transportation, equipment, and technology we use, to the media we see, to the responsibilities women carry, and even to the medicine we take, the world is "systematically ignoring half the population, often with disastrous consequences."

In writing <u>Invisible Women</u>, Mrs. Perez has traveled all over the world meeting and listening to women. She has collected their stories. The book also refers to an impressive range of case studies and research from around the world. All put together her book reveals the thousands of hidden ways in which women are forgotten and the impact it has on us all.

Our branch Adelante group read and discussed the book in November, and we have decided that Invisible Women is a book every woman and her daughter should read. The book is not difficult to read, despite the statistics. We think you will be both fascinated and amazed. There are many aspects of a woman's life she takes for granted and would be made easier very simply, if someone would just ask us first. There is a reason why women often have to wear an extra sweater to work in an office or why we are 47% more likely to be injured in an auto accident. In short, we would like to recommend Invisible Women for your reading experience during the coming winter days.
